

Food Plots on Your Property

Would you like to see more wildlife in your area? Animals are more likely to spend time in places where their basic needs are met, such as food, water, and shelter.

Illinois has a ban on the feeding of wild deer and other wildlife in areas where wild deer are present. The ban was enacted in 2002 in an effort to limit the spread of chronic wasting disease (CWD). One exception to the "feeding" rule is food plots! Illinois hunters or property owners wishing to better their viewing of wildlife are legally able to manage their property in a handful of ways that will result in the attraction of deer and other wildlife, including leaving some standing crops and/or installing food plots.



Around August is a great time to plant late-season food plots for winter cover and nutrients. The Coles County SWCD has order forms to purchase seed mixes developed for deer, turkey, and other wildlife. Seed can also be bough at other local seed dealers.

Food plots can be as small as 1/4 an acre and grow from there, but the larger the area, and the better the cover surrounding the area, the more likely you are to attract wildlife.

If you are interested in setting up a food plot on your property, feel free to stop by our office and we can help you get started on your project.




You'll need:

- · Gallon-size resealable plastic bag
- · Pint-size resealable plastic bag
- · Kitchen towel
- · 1/2 cup milk or half & half
- · 1/4 teaspoon vanilla
- · 1 tablespoon sugar
- · Ice cubes
- · 6 tablespoons rock salt

Procedure:

- 1. Fill the large bag half full of ice. Add rock salt.
- 2. Add the milk, vanilla, and sugar into the small bag.
- 3. Seal the small bag. (You can use two small bags to prevent leaking.)
- 4. Place the small bag into the large bag.
- 5. Seal the large bag.
- 6. Place the kitchen towel around the large bag.
- 7. Shake for 5 minutes or until the mixture turns into ice cream.
- 8. Enjoy!



watersafe Well Water Testing Kits

Nitrate levels have been rising in Illinois' drinking water. Shallow rural wells are particularly vulnerable to nitrate contamination. Nationally, 20% of these wells have exceeded the level considered safe by the U.S. EPA. Public water utilities are required to test their water for nitrate, but if you own your well it is up to you to make sure it is safe.

Finding high levels of nitrate in your water is an indicator that your well may be receiving surface water and is more likely to be contaminated with other chemicals. The Coles County SWCD sells well water test kits that test for 10 contaminates for only \$30.

Upcoming Pollinator Events

Butterfly Festival

Saturday, August 2, 11-3 pm

Charleston Lake, Charleston, IL.



Learn about and celebrate the efforts in the community to increase biodiversity! Join local food vendors for lunch, listen to live music, enjoy children's activities, attend presentations and visit booths from local conservation and non-conservation organizations, and more. Coles County SWCD will have a booth at this event, so make sure to stop by and say hello! We will be making wildflower "bombs" for you to bring home and help spread pollinator-friendly flowers to your own backyard.

This event is also happening during the Urban Butterfly Initiative's Butterfly Blitz. From July 26th to August 3rd. People of all ages are encouraged to take photos of any butterflies they see in the Charleston area and log them in the iNaturalist app. If you do, the UBI booth will have a special patch for you to pick up during The Butterfly Festival.

Pollinator Habitat Monitoring Field Day

Tuesday, September 16th, 9-12 pm

Warbler Bottoms, Charleston, IL.

Are you interested in understanding how new technologies and tools can assess habitat quality? The University of Illinois, Southern Illinois University, and the Electric Power Research Institute received funding from the USDA Conservation Reserve Program to evaluate how new technologies can be leveraged to monitor the quality of CRP pollinator habitat. This research project will explore the use of drones and satellite imagery to develop habitat metrics such as flower cover, bare soil, and woody cover, which can assess habitat value for pollinators.

Environmental DNA is another tool the project team is evaluating as a way to document pollinator richness. Remotely collected imagery and eDNA data are ground validated using traditional vegetation and pollinator field sampling methods. The research team will be hosting a field day in collaboration with Grand Prairie Friends. Learn more about this research and for a demonstration of technologies under evaluation. During the field day, we will discuss technologies that can assess habitat quality and inform management including: 1) drone imagery, 2) satellite imagery, 3) ground photography, 4) airborne eDNA, and 5) pollinator eDNA. The field demonstrations will include drone flights, two types of eDNA sampling, and traditional survey methods performed for both vegetation and pollinators.
